Mission and Vision

To relieve financial hardship, poverty and associated adversity in East Sussex and surrounding areas through provision of clothing and essential items for babies and children to families in need.

To reduce waste and promote reuse through the collection of good quality baby and children's clothing and essential items.

To receive referrals from professionals who ensure recipient eligibility of support through the act of making a referral.

To support partner agencies and organisations in their work with vulnerable families through effective and timely response to their requests of items.

Where donations to Family2Family do not meet our standard, to maximise recycling and minimise those disposed of.

To remove some financial burden on families in their time of need, through the gifting of good quality and safe items, inspiring hope and change.

To provide a well-regarded and recommended service which benefits those who donate, access, and receive goods from Family2Family.

To adhere to relevant product safety standards and ensure items are in good, clean, and useable condition.

To organise fundraising events and secure grants to cover running costs and purchase essential items to benefit families.

To offer volunteering opportunities and link with businesses and other ventures who share Family2Family's values and ethos.

To gift all bundles without any cost to the families who receive them, or professionals who refer.



What we do

Family2Family collects donations of baby and children's clothing and essential items and redistributes them to families in need in East Sussex and surrounding areas.

The process is simple:

Donations of clothing and essential items for children aged 0 - 16 years are made to Family2Family. We ask that they are in **excellent condition**; items donators would feel happy to use with their own child or those they care about. This is to ensure families feel they have received a gift from the community in their time of need, as opposed to a handout. Prior to donating, we ask people to check our monthly wishlist (published on our website and socials) and to book a time slot to bring their items to us.

Family2Family volunteers then sort and safety check donations ready to be gifted to families.

Referrals are made by professionals on behalf of families in need of support. This is done through our online referral form. The items requested are then put together into a carefully prepared bundle, specific to the needs of the baby/child(ren) and family. The professional is advised when the bundle is ready for collection, and they deliver it to the family.

Receiving referrals from professionals means it has **already been need assessed**, so we can accept every referral made to us and only need to collect limited information about the family so we can put together a tailored bundle for them, whilst they remain anonymous. Asking for help can be difficult, even when things feel different and we believe this level of separation from our beneficiaries can **enable them to access support** through professionals they already have a relationship with.

At Family2Family we understand life can be busy and commitments can change. We offer a variety of flexible volunteer roles so our volunteers can be involved as and when suits them. Our bundles

When a professional makes a referral on behalf of a family they're supporting, they can select as few or as many items needed by the family. Once the referral has been received by Family2Family, the items are carefully put together specific to the requirements of the family. Where additional information is given about the likes, interests and individual needs of a child or family, we always do our best to make the bundle as personal as possible. The majority of the items we gift fall into eight categories:



The gift of sleep

Family2Family provides safe and cosy sleep items for babies and toddlers. From Moses baskets through to toddler beds, every bed is gifted with a brand-new mattress. Sheets and blankets are also provided so that beds can be assembled and used on the day they arrive with the family, providing an immediate improvement to the family environment; a safe place for little one to get some well needed sleep – perfect!

The gift of adventure

Gifting prams, slings, (and if purchased new) car seats, enables families to access the great outdoors, exercise, socialise, visit groups and appointments, and benefit from integrating in the community.

The gift of comfort

Baby toiletry bundles, nappies, and hygiene products for the whole family! Whilst adults toiletry products can't be requested on our referral form, we always add these as a surprise addition to our bundles.

The gift of safety

Items like safety gates and cupboard clips keep little ones from getting onto stairs or into cupboards. We often have requests for safety gates where families are living in temporary accommodation and need to stop mobile infants from getting into kitchens without doors.

The gift of play

Playing is the key to early learning. Our toy and book bundles are age appropriate, and promote both independent play and opportunities to interact with caregivers and other family members, which in turn supports good relationships.

The gift of dignity

Helping mums-to-be prepare for birth. Our mum-to-be bundles include breast pads, maternity pads, and toiletry bags filled with essential hygiene miniatures for hospital bags complete with some added pamper products to make sure Mum knows people care.

The gift of pride

Our clothing bundles are packed with love. All clothing is of excellent quality, folded neatly and presented in a reusable bag complete with gift tag. We provide a weeks worth of infant clothes including vests, babygrows and outfits, and for older children, a range of clothing for all weathers, including sleepwear, brand-new underwear and a coat in winter.

The gift of nourishment

Whilst we don't redistribute baby food or milk, we do gift essential items to support feeding. This includes items like highchairs, feeding pillows, bottles, weaning items, and plastic plates, cups and cutlery.

Our Impact

In our seventh year we supported **699 families** through our core service. Within these families **1399 babies and children were gifted essential items.**

The essential items redistributed, valued as if purchased secondhand would be **worth more than £300,000.** Items distributed included:

The gift of pride.

Clothing bundles including numerous outfits, pyjamas and coats were gifted to 986 children

The gift of sleep.

Cots, toddler beds, cribs and moses baskets, sheets, duvets, duvet sets: **2,921** items (not including Beds4Kids figures)

The gift of play.

Toy bundles, book bundles, playmats and bouncy chairs: 1,197

The gift of adventure:

Prams, buggies, buggy boards, reins and slings: 198

The gift of nourishment:

Highchairs, bottles, and other feeding equipment: 2,389 items

The gift of comfort and the gift of dignity.

2,581 toiletry bundles, nappy packs, wipes, and mum-to-be bundles

The gift of safety.

A local issue

In 2022/23, the number of children living in poverty increased by 100,000 from 4.2 million in 2021/22 to 4.3 million children. That's 30% of children in the UK. Figures shown are drawn from the End Child Poverty Coalition local area estimates for the year 2021/22. This provides an 'After Housing Costs' estimate of the 'relative poverty' rate for children in each constituency. A household is considered to be in 'relative poverty' if their income is below 60% of the median UK household income for that year.



Why we do it

Through the simple act of redistribution and reuse, Family2Family gifts families in need of support with essential items for their children including prams, cots, toddler beds, clothing, toiletries, bedding and toys. Receiving these items provides an immediate improvement to their situation, provides hope, and often demonstrates kindness to some who have seldom experienced it. In addition we have feedback from professionals who have recognised an improvement in parental mental health and wellbeing on receiving a Family2Family bundle, which in turn, improves their ability to focus on other aspects of parenting and ultimately benefits babies and children in their care.

We have gifted bundles to families experiencing challenges which include low income, mental health issues, domestic abuse, homelessness (or risk of), care leavers, young parents, asylum seekers, and women who have been trafficked. Many of these families were isolated and vulnerable and were truly overwhelmed to receive such gifts.


We believe that receiving a bundle from Family2Family can cause a ripple effect in the life of a struggling family. Receiving physical items improves day-to-day quality of life, and the process of receiving quality, well presented items improves wellbeing, relieves stress and strained relationships, and enables parents to meet the needs of their children.



Family2Family is proud to support families across East Sussex and surrounding areas. Professionals who refer families are asked to come and collect their bundles from us in Crowborough. The bundles then make their way to households across the county, and sometimes further afield: items moved from one family to another and making a huge difference to those in need.

All the families we support have low income, and there are usually other adversities impacting them too. These can be temporary or prolonged but all contribute to the challenges they are facing and add to the need for support from Family2Family. In addition to the factors below, we support migrants and asylum seekers, children and young people in care, and some who have been trafficked.

We are proud to work with a variety of professionals and organisations who are working with some of the most vulnerable families in our community, including Social Workers, Foodbanks, Refugee charities, and refuges for women and children.





Milestones

Every summer we treat our team to a celebratory afternoon – tea, to thank them for their time and commitment supporting local children and families. This year we enjoyed a lovely afternoon at Buxted Park Hotel.

We were delighted to welcome The Lord Lieutenant of East Sussex to hear about our work and meet some of our dedicated team.

All fundraisers held for our cause are vital and appreciated. Amongst funds raised for us in our seventh year, were those from the Ashdown Golfers Captains Charity.

We were blown away by the support from Brambletye school who selected us as their charity of the year and raised a staggering amount of more than £37,000.





Corporate volunteering sessions are beneficial to all involved and we welcomed some of the team from AXA for a wholesome morning of volunteering.

In December our community were treated to a charity ice skating session thanks to Collins & Sons who donated the two hour slot to Family2Family. In the spirit of Christmas giving, we decided to keep these tickets free of charge and offer them out to our amazing network. It was real Christmas magic to see children and families enjoying this time.





Through our membership of the Baby Bank Alliance we were thrilled to be selected as one of ten baby banks in the UK to receive a donation of an electric van from Mercedes. The van has subsequently been wrapped and we are excited to put our plans for the van in to action.

In February 2025 we took on the lease of a second site which will host our campaigns, as well as a brand new initiative to further our work supporting families and the environment.


In the UK, more than 400,000 children are without a suitable bed of their own. In our referrals we hear of children sleeping on duvets on the floor, and had a request of support for a family of 5 children who all slept in one bed.

Buttle UK found that 30% of low-income households struggled to afford beds for their children in 2020 and the number is on the rise. Not having a bed to sleep in impacts neurological, physical and emotional development and affects all aspects of a child's life including education, mood, wellbeing, and relationships.

Following a successful Crowdfunder in 2023, and subsequent funding in 2024 Family2Family launched Beds4Kids – this campaign sees children gifted new beds, mattresses and bedding – needless to say, this provision has a huge positive impact on the beneficiaries both in the short and long term. We are seeking corporate sponsors for this campaign.

Every summer we launch our Bags4School campaign; providing brand new backpacks complete with school essentials so children from families experiencing hardship can start or return to school in September equipped with the same things as their peers. There are many benefits to this provision – not only are children given the best possible start to the school year by having the things they need, but the social benefit of 'fitting in' means they are more likely to form or sustain friendships, less likely to suffer stigma or bullying. Overall, this will all contribute to better mental health and self-esteem.

gifts4Kids



In the run up to Christmas we are extra busy; on top of our core service we open our Christmas campaign. Gifts4Kids sees Family2Family collect donations of brand new toys and gifts for children 0 - 16 years who are living in East Sussex (or surrounding areas) and are otherwise likely to go without a gift.

Christmas 2023 saw a huge increase in demand for this campaign (almost 50%!) but incredibly, with support from local individuals and various businesses, we were able to provide great quality gifts for all 705 children referred. Each child received a main gift, secondary gift and stocking filler gift. Whilst we don't collect information about families that would make them recognisable, we asked referees to provide details about the children's interests and needs so we could ensure gifts were well matched.
